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ABOUT CANYON COUNTY

CLIMATE: Canyon County enjoys a climate with all four seasons, including snowy winters, and a semi-arid environment with lots of sunshine. The Treasure Valley area, where Canyon County is located, has a relatively mild climate, with winters often having milder temperatures than other areas at similar latitudes. The surrounding mountains receive more snowfall due to higher elevation and orographic wind effects. Much of the winter precipitation is overnight.

RECREATION: Canyon County is the heart of Idaho's Wine Country and Sunnyslope Wine Trail. Outdoor recreation abounds in the Caldwell area. The Boise River meanders through the north portion of the county, Indian Creek winds through downtown Caldwell, Lake Lowell is in the middle of the county, and the Snake River forms the southern boundary.

Canyon County enjoys a mix of some of the richest and most diverse productive irrigated farmland in the nation, which provides a myriad of crops along with wide-open views. You're seldom more than 20 minutes from the dining, social, recreation, and nighttime activities of the cities and small towns. Nampa is home to the Ford Idaho Center and the famous Snake River Stampede, while Caldwell hosts the Canyon County Fair and Caldwell Night Rodeo. You can enjoy 6 golf courses, dozens of indoor and outdoor pickleball, tennis, and basketball courts, and sports complexes, as well as the College of Idaho and Northwest Nazarene University.
